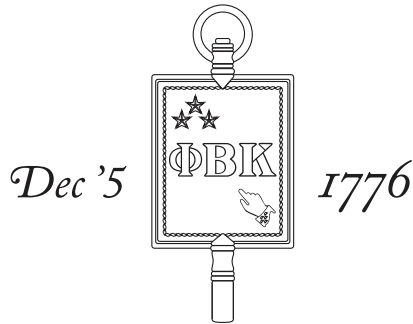

About Phi Beta Kappa and the Zeta of North Carolina Chapter

The Zeta of North Carolina Chapter of Phi Beta Kappa was chartered on 17 April 1995, reflecting national recognition of the outstanding quality of the students, programs, and resources for undergraduate education in the liberal arts and sciences at North Carolina State University.

The purpose of the Phi Beta Kappa Society is to recognize and encourage scholarship, friendship, and cultural interests, and to support excellence and integrity in the pursuit of the liberal arts and sciences.

Election to Phi Beta Kappa recognizes intellectual capacities well-employed, especially in acquiring an education in the liberal arts and sciences. Phi Beta Kappa honors and supports an educational process that exalts openness to divergent views, the interplay of ideas, inquiry, and integrity, and the accomplishments of the human mind and spirit.

The objectives of humane learning encouraged by Phi Beta Kappa include the acquisition of knowledge and the cultivation of understanding, support for intellectual honesty and tolerance, and the development of breadth in the range of intellectual interests.

The Phi Beta Kappa Society was founded at the College of William and Mary in 1776. Chapters were established at Harvard, Yale, and Dartmouth before the end of the 18th century, setting a pattern for slow expansion that has continued to the present. Only 280 institutions of higher learning in the United States shelter chapters of Phi Beta Kappa.

There are seven chapters of Phi Beta Kappa sheltered at colleges and universities in North Carolina: the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (Alpha, 1904), Duke University (Beta, 1920), Davidson College (Gamma, 1923), Wake Forest University (Delta, 1941), the University of North Carolina at Greensboro (Epsilon, 1956; but originally chartered as a section of the Alpha chapter in 1934), North Carolina State University (Zeta, 1995), and Elon University (Eta, 2010).
